Blessing Homes on the Feast of the Epiphany

There is a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord (6th January) when the family gather to ask for God's blessing on their home and family life. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes.

The tradition of the chalking of the door asks God's blessing of the home and all who live there.

Take some chalk and write the initials of the three wise men over the inside of your door.

It should look like this: 20+C+M+B+2X
20 being the millennium.

C standing for the first wise man, Caspar.

M standing for Melchior, the second wise man.

B standing for Balthazar, the third wise man.

The 2X stands for the year.
